AMENDED ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLAINT

COMES NOW, the Petitioner, Department of Professional Regulation, hereinafter referred to as "Petitioner", and files this Administrative Complaint before the Board of Veterinary Medicine, against, Mustafa Saleh, D.V.M., hereinafter referred to as "Respondent", and alleges:

1. Petitioner is the state agency charged with regulating the practice veterinary medicine pursuant to Section 20.30, Chapter 455, and Chapter 474, Florida Statutes.

2. Respondent is, and has been at all times material hereto, a licensed veterinarian, license number VM 0002759, whose address of record is 11372 State Road 84, Davie, Florida 33324.

3. On or about December 28, 1987, T.T. took her male dog to the Respondent's for an examination of a lump on his testicles.

4. Dog was neutered and no apparent problems were noted.

5. On or about December 29, 1989 at approximately 3:00 p.m., T.T. called the Respondent and informed him that dog had not urinated since 10:00 p.m. the previous evening.

6. Respondent's tentative diagnosis was "viral gastritis". It was also diagnosed that the patient was microfilaria positive.

7. On or about December 29, 1987 at 8:00 p.m. the dog was still vomiting and was still anuric. Respondent told T.T. to wait another 24-48 hours before hospitalization.

8. On or about December 30, 1987, dog was catheterized and hospitalized by another veterinarian.

9. Inconsistencies and discrepancies existed in patient records, treatment, and correspondence between Ms. Tompkins and Dr. Saleh.

10. Respondent's diagnosis of dog in relation to test results was incorrect.


11. Based on the foregoing, Respondent violated Section 474.214(1)(o), Florida Statutes, by committing fraud, deceit, negligence, incompetency, or misconduct, in the practice of veterinary medicine.


